

Call for Views and Experiences of COVID-19, Disability and Race

Information about this survey and the Call for Views and Experience

This survey is seeking the views of people who work in adult social care about the experiences of Disabled people from Black, Asian and minoritised ethnic groups during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The information you provide will help us understand how things have been working for Disabled people during the pandemic and how discrimination may have worsened outcomes for Disabled people from Black, Asian and minoritised ethnic groups.

We will use the evidence to hold government to account over failings during the pandemic and to build solutions and support for transformative and sustainable change in adult social care.

The survey is part of a Commission on COVID-19, Disablism and Systemic Racism, led by the Voluntary Organisations Disability Group (VODG) and funded by the Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust. The Commission aims to gather evidence of the harm experienced by Disabled people Black, Asian and minoritised communities during the COVID-19 pandemic, to find out why this happened and to build solutions for lasting change.

What will it involve?

The survey should take 10 - 15 minutes of your time.

We will ask about your views and experiences of the COVID-19 pandemic and the government's pandemic response. We will also ask for your views on what should have been done differently during the



pandemic and what needs to change for the future.

There are some closed questions requiring a Yes / No / Don't Know response, but most of the questions are open, requiring you to respond in your own words. For these questions, please use these questions and the prompts as a guide. We want to hear what you feel is most important to share.

How will your information be used?

The information you provide will be combined with those of other respondents and analysed together to draw out common patterns and themes.

Whether or not you remain anonymous, all the information you provide will be treated as confidential. We may use direct quotes from your responses, however, any identifiable information will be removed.

The data will be stored securely online using on VODG's Microsoft 365 system. No personal information will be exported and all data will be deleted twelve months after the work of the Commission has concluded.

Your participation is voluntary and you can choose to withdraw at any time. You are entitled to ask that part, or all, of the record of your involvement be deleted at any time.

VODG is committed to protecting privacy when we collect information about individuals. When using this type of information, we adhere to the principles of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), to professional ethical guidelines and to VODG's privacy policy.
